

# 1invest Swix 40 ETF



Fund information update at 30 June 2022

## What is the fund's objective?

The objective of the 1invest Swix 40 ETF is to track the FTSE/JSE Shareholder Weighted 40 Index (SWIX40) as closely as possible.

## What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests in the constituents of the SWIX40 Index and aims to replicate the Index by holding the same weightings of these constituents. The SWIX40 is an equity Index of the 40 largest companies by shareholder weighted net market capitalisation, listed on the JSE. Shareholder weighted indices reduce constituent weights by foreign shareholdings and therefore represent South African investors. The fund is rebalanced quarterly and therefore has minimal trading costs. The fund may also hold a small portion in cash instruments and listed derivatives to effect efficient portfolio management.

## What possible risks are associated with this fund?

Risks include general market conditions and market volatility, company specific risk, economic and political risk.

**Total Expense (TER):** This ratio shows the charges, levies and fees relating to the management of the portfolio and is expressed as a percentage of the average net asset value of the portfolio, calculated over the period shown and annualised to the most recently completed quarter. **Total Investment Charges (TIC):** This ratio is simply the sum of the TER and TC, showing the percentage of the value of the fund incurred as costs relating to the investment of the fund. It should be noted that performance figures account for all costs included in the TIC ratio, so you should not deduct the TIC from performance figures, the performance is already net of the TIC.

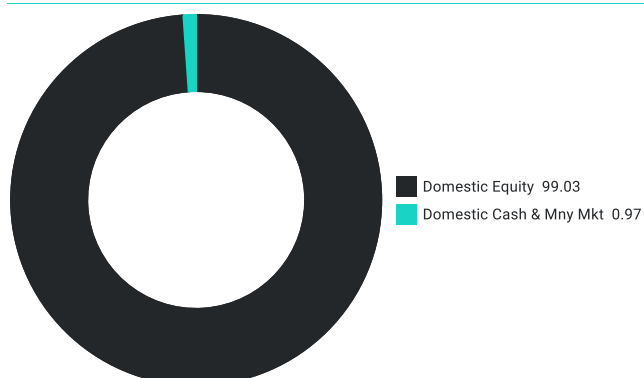

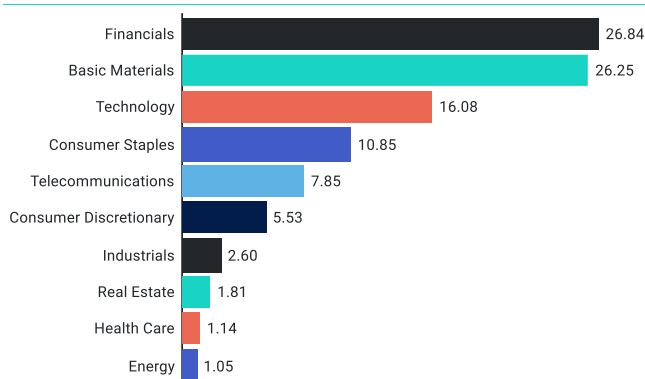

## Commentary

### Fund review

The fund performed in-line with the index over the quarter. The last quarterly review of the index saw no changes to the index. The fund benefited from its exposure to Naspers Ltd, Prosus NV and British American Tobacco Plc, which were the top three performers, with Naspers Ltd returning 42.28% over the quarter. However, its exposure to Gold Fields Ltd, Sibanye Stillwater Ltd and MTN Group Ltd detracted from performance over the quarter, as these were the three worst performers in the fund. Gold Fields Ltd returned -32.91% over the quarter.

### Market overview

Q2 2022 saw a drop in growth expectations globally, coupled with growing fears of a global recession with various central banks hiking rates aggressively with inflation targeting in mind. In addition, the effects following the sanctions imposed on Russia due to its invasion of the Ukraine have continued to materialise in asset prices. Consequently, commodity prices surged as supply pressures heightened globally for oil and other commodities of which Russia is a net exporter. The global economy slowed, and US inflation reached a 40-year high of 8.6% as at the end of May 2022, with the FOMC Chair noting that they are set on stabilising prices no matter the cost. As a result, the FOMC maintained its hawkish stance leading to a 0.75% increase in rates in June, the largest such increase since 1994, which sent a further shock throughout markets worldwide. Global markets felt the pressure and were mainly in the red over the quarter with the MSCI World falling -8.8%, MSCI EM at -7.1%, and the MSCI EMEA at -10.6%. Locally, the president repealed COVID-19 restrictions that emphasised mask wearing indoors and imposed limitations on gatherings giving further momentum to the re-opening of the economy. The local market was not spared from the effects of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, with surging commodity prices driving the petrol price to uncharted territory. Local indices plummeted with the Top 40 falling -8.1%, All Share at -8.0%, Capped SWIX ALSI at -7.5%, ALBI at -3.1% and the ZAR weakening by -3.9% relative to the USD.

### Looking ahead

Global inflation continues to surge with restrictive monetary policy taking effect. Both the FOMC and the MPC expected to continue tightening over the remainder of the year. Consequently, recession fears have emerged, and we expect this to be the dominant theme for the second half of 2022. As a result, economic growth expectations have declined globally and we expect risky asset classes (e.g., equities) to be adversely affected. Though the recent decision to repeal COVID-19 restrictions in South Africa can be expected to boost the local economy, the hawkish MPC stance remains a key focus point. Furthermore, Eskom's loadshedding has introduced the most power cuts in history, leading to more risk to the country's fragile economy. On a lighter note, the Tourism industry is expected to be one of the largest gainers from the decision regarding COVID-19 regulations. Other major risks to consider are broader geopolitical tensions, especially the situation between Russia and Ukraine. Should these countries fail to reach a peace agreement soon, the global energy crisis will be exacerbated, with oil and gas already under significant pressure. Broad supply chain pressures are expected with accompanying cost push inflation.
